PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Gentlemen,

The interpretation, and enforcing, of the rules of the game are our main function and Season 1967 showed just what is possible when a determined effort is made and maintained. There was, of course, a great incentive. We had new rules which imposed heavier penalties, but in the main it was the persistency of the referees which forced the Clubs to play to the rules and the result of this was apparent at the close of the season. We saw football as it should be played, penalties not lightly conceded and in consequence increased patronage.

How different the picture in England. Our greatest dream is uniformity of interpretation so that no matter where the game is played the rules follow the same pattern, and yet we have the sorry picture, we have all seen on television, of the game in England. Whilst this situation is allowed to continue we will always have trouble and I think you will all agree with me when I say that it is about time somebody exercised a bit of authority. The problems confronting the Australian Managers were, to say the least, deplorable and it has become farcical when a member nation of the International Board decides to make its own rules and force visiting teams to observe them. Without any doubt Australian authority lost ground as well as a wonderful opportunity to display fortitude.

The Annual Report submitted to you tonight by your Office Bearers is an excellent one and is truly indicative of the work done in the Association. I do not propose to comment on it except to express my appreciation for the service rendered by your officers. However, I would like to offer my congratulations to our newly elected Life Members, to those members of the Association who gained the "plums" and to the District and 2nd Division Clubs who were successful in their Premierships. I am sure all members will support me also in paying a tribute to Eastern Suburbs Club who lifted themselves up by the bootstraps to prove that tackling and playing to the rules of the game can bring success.

We had many visitors to our Association this year. Unfortunately the N.Z. Managers were unable to attend but we appreciated their representatives. To all of our visitors I say "come again". I was also pleased to welcome the President of the Federation of N.S.W. Soccer Referees for the first time. This liaison should continue.

Our Social events were again admirably conducted, well patronized and successful. This is what keeps an Association together - keep at it.

To my successor I say "fear not" - you will have the support of the members and of everybody connected with refereeing.

Good luck to you all and may the Association continue to go from strength to strength in a true spirit of harmony.

Gentlemen,

Probably the most outstanding feature of the Rugby League Year just concluded was the successful introduction of the Four Tackle Rule and the retention of the ball by the non offending team after the ball from a penalty found touch.

The League generally, and the Public by their enthusiasm, showed their appreciation of the efforts of all Referees in bringing about the smooth operation of the changeover.

The disappointment of the Season was once again finding that other countries had adopted without a majority agreeing, rules contrary to those of the International Board. That the changes could possibly be an improvement does not alter the ideal situation of all participating Leagues of adopting and playing under the rules as laid down by the International Board.

It is pleasing to report that the General Committee of the League were always respectful of your Delegates in debate. We certainly did not always achieve our purpose but the year generally could be measured as being a successful one with every possibility of further improvement in 1968.

A major breakthrough in ground improvements was set in motion this year with the League setting up a Special Fund to assist Clubs and Councils to make suburban ovals real Football Areas. The first proof of this should be seen in 1968 at Belmore Oval, where work started sometime ago and is well advanced.

The better football atmosphere at these improved grounds should produce a more exciting brand of play, thus helping our referees in controlling their fixtures.

Finally, gentlemen, it has been a pleasure to serve as your delegate.

OUR DIAMOND JUBILEE YEAR

As this is our Diamond Jubilee Year, let's go back and look at some of our history from some of the records held. These should interest all Referees.

The first meetings of the Association were held in 1907 but unfortunately due to the departure of a Mr. O'Farrell to New Zealand, the records cannot be found.

On 13th March, 1908 the inaugural meeting was held and the officials were elected as follows -

President: Mr. Hoyle

Vice Presidents: Messrs. McCabe, Trumper, Burden,
Giltinan and Messenger

Secretary: A.C. Welch
Treasurer: G. Boss
Delegate to Council: G. Boss
General Committee: Messrs. Costello, Hooper, Heulen, Buchanan and Hansen
Examination Board: Messrs. Costello, McCabe, Hooper, Burden and Heulen.
Auditors: Messrs. Knox and Trumper.

The Association's records reveal that for the first five years, membership was limited to thirty members and these men controlled all games in the Metropolitan Area.

Referees were paid four shillings expenses for centres and Touch Judges two & sixpence, and out of these fees they paid approximately 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ % into Association Funds to cover administration costs, hire of meeting room, and each member also paid threepence per meeting extra to cover costs of gas for lighting of meeting room.

Early meetings were held at the Supreme Court House Hotel, King Street on a Monday evening of each week. At the end of the first season a Smoke Concert was held and cost the Association One Pound.

The First Bucks' Picnic was held at Clareville, Sandringham, 1910 and each member volunteered to pay four shillings towards expenses.

Two Drays were hired from an Undertaker to provide transport to the Picnic Grounds, four singing artists come musicians were hired at two shillings each to entertain members.

Referees haven't changed much because at the Picnic twenty-five members were present plus visitors (not many according to records) and the following refreshments were consumed -

- 27 Gallons of Beer
- 2 Dozen Quarts of Pale Ale donated by Tooheys Brewery
- 6 Bottles of Whisky
- 5 Gallons of Ginger Beer
- 4 Dozen Lemonade
- 2 Dozen Bottles of Soda

Evidence shows that a Referee was sent to referee a match at Rosedale but after spending all the afternoon looking, he was unable to locate the ground and the League refused to pay his expenses. The Association then came to his aid and paid his expenses. The Association was responsible for all Senior and Junior Matches and from the records it is evident both in early and later years that the League has kept a tight rein on Referees fees and donations to the Association.

Referees only received their Referees Certificates of Competency after two years active service and the prime mover in this was that famous J. (Dinny) Murray (now deceased).

Many lectures were held on the rules and Referees were very strict, especially towards players using insulting remarks. Evidence shows the late Tom McMahon taking Police action against a player for using insulting remarks to him in a Senior game. The Association stood behind Mr. McMahon and guaranteed to pay any court expenses.

Well gentlemen, I could write for days and tell you about some more interesting things that happened but I feel I must cease. Maybe one day the League will create a library where the History of the game will be held and these records can be passed over for all members to read.

In closing just let us give a thought to some of the early greats of your Association - Messrs. L. Baggot, A. Ballerum, J. Buchannan, T. Costello, L. Kearney, F. Delaney, H. Millington, T. McMahon, J. (Dinny) Murray, Lal Deane, Webby Neill and J. Hansen. Now in later years we think of Messrs. J. Davies, Alec Spankie, Austin Shiner, Jack O'Brien, Os Cohen, Tom Brennan, Joe McGauley, Darcy Lawler, George Bishop, Joe Moses, Cyril Wigzell, Baden Wales (Senior), Joe Griffin, Ray Smyth, Arthur Davis, Col Pearce, Ray O'Donnell and many others too numerous to mention.

These men and many others built a fine Association, one of which we can be justly proud and to them we say thank you for allowing us present members to celebrate the Diamond Jubilee Year.
