To the President, Treasurer, Assistant Secretary, Social Secretary, my co-delegate and all members of the Sub-Committees, I thank you for your very valuable assistance during the Season.

Finally, gentlemen, I thank all members for your support and I can only reiterate that it is a pleasure and a privilege to serve you as your Secretary.
