The General Fund is in credit, thanks to donations from the New South Wales Rugby Football League and W.D. & H.O. Wills - the Association appreciates their generosity and support which enabled us to complete the year without any further call upon members.

Costs continue to rise and the Association has been caught up in the inflationary trend that prevails. This is the first year that Stamp Duty has been imposed on all cheques.

Banks have instituted management charges and discontinued payment of interest on Society cheque accounts, unless transactions can be kept below certain limits. I am pleased to inform that all except the Fees Account were able to meet the requirements, but to offset this, a Fees Savings Account was opened and operated in conjunction with the Fees Cheque Account.
