

Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen.

Submitted for your approval and adoption, is your 1971 Annual Report and Balance Sheet.

It is to be hoped that if the International Board meets this year in England whilst Mr. Buckley is visiting that the Board re-introduce the rule where players cannot move inside the 5 yards until the ball comes clear of the ruck. This would further speed up the game.

The overall refereeing standard this year in my opinion was of a very good standard and we saw some very keen competition for Semis, Finals and Grand Final.

Number one Plum this year, the Grand Final, went to Keith Holman and whilst we have already congratulated Keith I feel we must say congratulations once again.

I know we are all proud to have Keith in our ranks because we don't win many ex players particularly an ex international of Keith's standard.

Whilst some of our members have come under fire from Club Officials and coaches, then my advice to them is just ignore these stupid fellows because they are only letting off steam to make up for their deficiencies.
