DELEGATE'S REPORT

Gentlemen,

Rugby League in the N.S.W. competition certainly enjoyed a very successful season in 1986. Under the Board, now very much consolidated in its position, the game blossomed. A ten per cent increase in attendances in a supposedly recessed economy must have been extremely satisfying. The completion of Parramatta Stadium and resultant capacity season crowds that attended that venue proved people will support the code whilst ever you provide them with good facilities.

The standard of competition was high, particularly at Representative level. No-one could have asked for a better State of Origin or Test Series and attendences reflected their brilliance. Panasonic Cup, Monday Night Football and their associated moves to other metropolitan grounds further improved support of the game which again culminated in an interesting and exciting final series.

The position of Referees Co-ordinator was established to fill the gap that has existed (and always will exist) between club officials and Referees. We thank Denis Braybrook for his fresh approach and his enthusiasm in this appointment. Centre opportunities given to all those keen to blow a whistle and show their ability was long overdue as was the consolidation of active numbers that occurred. Double up of touch appointments were frequent but easily managed and the opportunity given to selected District Referees to run grade lines was to me one of the most pleasing features of the season. With clubs frequently providing barristers for their players the referee, through the League, should be represented by an advocate at Judiciary and thus remove some of the tension and the feeling of inadequacy that is associated in such confrontation.

I thank you for the opportunity to represent this Association at the General Committee level.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Gentlemen,

On behalf of the Association, I submit to you the Financial Statements of the Association for the 1986 Season.

The method of managing the finances of the Association undertook a dramatic change during the past season. Firstly, active Referees were paid directly by the New South Wales Rugby League and deductions forwarded directly to this Association. Whilst some hiccups inevitably occur when new systems are devised, nevertheless they were minor and I thank Erica Lizzo, Financial Controller of the League, and her staff, for their co-operation. As a result of this move, the Fees account has now been closed and its contents placed to the credit of the General Fund.

Secondly, due to an increased grant from TNT, the executive agreed to undertake greater direct responsibility for some expenses traditionally met by the Sponsorship. These expenses are reflected in the attached accounts.

Thirdly, due to insurance cover with City Mutual and the compulsory State insurance fund, it is my belief that the Assurance fund as it now exists is no longer necessary. In my opinion, steps should be taken to wind the account up and have the contents dealt with as recommended by the Association.

The changes will not end there. There are others in the wind which will probably cause some difficulty if proceeded with.

I have always maintained the highest regard for Ian McCall and Frank Walsh. If anything, the past twelve months have served to strengthen that regard.
