I'll accept that these referees have commitments to their employers, but their absence means that aspiring referees no longer have the opportunity to meet and mix with them. In the past, this opportunity assisted their development. It is conceivable that some of our newer referees might never get to meet referees they are seeking to emulate.

On the brighter side, I congratulate the members on their achievements, I congratulate the executive on their efforts for the Association and wish the best of everything for you all in 2001.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Gentlemen

The most dominating factor in the affairs of the Association during the past season was the changes to the selection, on field role and career path of those members officiating as centre referees and/or touch judges in the NRL Competition. Whether one agrees or disagrees with the changes, I sure all would agree that what happened was a classical example of how not to manage change.

Initially the whole process was conducted without collaboration or consultation with the Association and with no apparent consideration to the effect of these changes on aspirants from 1st Division to Min-mod. Whilst there currently exists signs of a willingness for greater collaboration in the future, the damage has been done.

The loss of a large number of experienced officials at the beginning and during the season far exceeded the devastating depletion of the graded ranks when the NSWRL Second Division Competition collapsed in the seventies. Future policy makers must realise that, unlike players, very few referees return to other competitions once they withdraw or are eliminated from grade. The end result is more pressure on recruitment and retention of officials at the grass roots level.

Turning to the administrative side of our operations, the preoccupation with damage control as a consequence of the above mentioned matters resulted in no action being taken to commence the implementation of the Strategic Plan developed on the Association's behalf by Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu at a cost of fifteen thousand dollars.

The NRL took control of the referees sponsorship when it entered into a four year agreement with FAI at the beginning of the season. In its place the Association received a grant from the NRL. The grant was equal to what was obtained from sponsorship in 1999, but considerably less than what the value of the current FAI agreement and even less than the sponsorship funding received prior to the formation of the NRL. On the positive side however, the situation allows us to continue building upon the strong relationship that has developed over the years with FAI and Ansett. Bob Styles (Coordinator), Phil Cooley and Bryan Gilchrist are deserving of our gratitude for the manner in which they have managed the funding derived from sponsorship. Thanks also are extended to Lindsay Plowes and Bill Harrigan for their efforts in assisting the Sponsorship Committee entertain the representatives from sponsors during the year.

The standard of refereeing and touch judging at both the NRL and NSWRL levels left little doubt that this Association continues to develop and foster match officials of the highest quality.

Congratulations are extended to those members who were appointed to Representative and Final Series fixtures. Bill Harrigan via his appointment to the NRL Grand Final equaled Darcy Lawler's record of seven. Phil Cooley set a touch judging record by being appointed to the Anzac Test, the three State of Origin fixtures and the NRL Grand Final. Tony Archer refereed the First Division Grand Final.

Congratulations to those members who were honoured during the year for their off field contribution to Rugby League refereeing. In particular, to Steve Betts and Noel Bissett on their elevation to Life Membership of the Association, to Kevin Roberts on being awarded the Hansen Memorial Achievement Trophy and to Doug Winton on being represented with his Life Membership in recognition of twenty five years continuous service on the Associations Committee.

On behalf of all members I thank the Australian, the National and the New South Wales Rugby League for their assistance and support throughout the year. In particular, a special 'thank you' to Colin Love, Geoff Carr and Chris Turner (ARL/NSWRL), David Moffat, Graham Ammesley (NRL), John Coates and Martin Meredith (NSWRL) and Denis Spagatino in his role of NSWRL Referees Coaching Coordinator.

Tom Healy, as Social Secretary, once again has been outstanding. All our social events were extremely well organised, conducted and supported. To Tom and his Committee, consisting of Steve Betts and Frank Leonard, go our heartfelt thanks for a great social year.

To my Committee colleagues and other Office Bearers, I express the gratitude of all members to each and everyone of you for your efforts on behalf of the Association. In particular, I congratulate Michael Ryan, retiring Assistant Secretary, for his contribution to the welfare of the Association during his thirteen years in this office. Furthermore, I wish to thank Les Matthews and Paul Kalina, my fellow Executive Officers, for their cooperation and support throughout the year.

Our appointments in a dual coaching role as well as a brief from the NRL, challenging us to take refereeing forward in line with the development and professionalism of clubs, meant that there were going to be changes to the structure that we had all become accustomed to.

As with the introduction of anything new, there is always those who will fear the unknown and be critical of anything that challenges them to look outside the boundaries that they have always operated. We must say however that this group was by far in the minority and most of those associated with the NRL Referees adopted a "let's give it a go" approach.

With the introduction of a new model for refereeing, there were significant changes to the make-up of our squad after a strenuous pre-season / pre-Christmas program. A special congratulations must go to Bill Harrigan who officiated at a Test Match, Three Origin games, Finals series games and then completing a great year by officiating at the Grand Final with Distinction. NSW REFEREES' CO-ORDINATORS REPORT

I seem to repeat myself every year by saying it has been a difficult year for referees however, again this season has proved to be so. The National Rugby League (NRL) has had a major influence on how our referees have progressed during the year as never before.

With the appointment of Mr Peter Louis and Mr Brian Grant as NRL referee coaches, they introduced a new "model" which entailed using up and coming referees as Touch Judges. This meant they graded, into the NRL squad, nine (9) of our most talented young referees who predominantly officiated in First Division during season 99.

A requirement of this new "model" was the interchanging of these referees between the NRL first grade touchlines and central refereeing duties in the NSWRL First Division. This created numerous problems in the area of maintaining consistencies in refereeing performances in First Division during the early to mid part of the season.

If the NRL wishes to continue this system of interchanging referees on a regular basis there will be changes on how it is to be implemented in season 2001.

Also at the commencement and during the 2000 season there have been a large number of retirements from our active ranks. Referees who gave enormously to the game of rugby league. People who achieved considerable and can be proud of what they gave to the game. To Messrs Howell, Russell, Bonnie, Edney, Danks, Almond, R Lewis, Leonard, Healy, Ruttle, Field, O'Malley, Digby and Villa the NSW Rugby League and the refereeing fraternity is indebted to you for the loyalty, commitment, and contribution during your active careers.

This lead to a yawning gap in our NSWRL squad. However, what that allowed was the grading from our Junior Development Squad of seven (7) very able young referees (Jeff Younis, Tony De Las Herras, Jason and Jenny Robinson, Gavin Badger, Michael Harradine, Jason Walsh).

Amongst them was a first for the NSWRL and probably for this level of competition anywhere in the world, a female referee, Jenny Robinson.

Also graded this year were four (4) Touch Judges namely, David Adams, Peter Scriberas, David Astill and Glenn Jackson.

These young referees performed to a very high standard with a number of them given an opportunity to officiate in the First Division competition. To their credit, they stood up to the challenge and have put on notice our senior referees that they will be challenging their positions in season 2001.

Credit for the initial development of these young referees must be given to Les Mathews, Max Dunn, and Peter Bungalow and in previous years, Mick Ryan, all referees' coaches appointed by the NSWRL Referees' Association. Les, Max and Peter have worked very hard during the season and have gone to all our District Associations to further identify future talent. The reports given to me thus far is that as far as young referee talent we are sitting very well with a large number of prospects identified for season 2001 to train in our junior development squad.

The Final Series in the NSWRL competition was particularly successful for our graded referees as proved by their on-field performances. The First Division Grand Final team of Messrs. Tony Archer, Martin Ryan, Col Jones, Bob Flint and Mario Cafarelli performed superbly as did the Flegg Cup team of Messrs. Kelvin Jeffes, Phil Bartin, Bryan Gilchrist, Allan Farlow and Riley Brown.

Season 2001 as far as referees are concerned will be very interesting because we will see I am sure and confident the emergence of a number of young referees with the ability to go to the top. It will be a most challenging year for referee coaches, as it will require some intense and personalised coaching. However, I am quite confident that these young referees will step up and accept the challenge.

Again, the confidence Mr Chris Turner and his Board have shown to the NSWRL referees squad was rewarded by the performances the referees, touch judges and in goal judges displayed during the semi-finals and final series both in First Division and Flegg Cup competitions. The policy initiated by the NSWRL Board of requiring the NSWRL graded referees officiating the semi-finals and grand finals of the First Division and Flegg Cup competitions has been very successful and has proved a most beneficial tool in the development of referees. It is a policy that should continue to have the unqualified support of the NSWRL Board.

This season has seen the introduction of new two-way communication between touch judges and referees on the football field. It has had problems that will need rectification prior to the commencement of the 2001 season. However, overall it was most beneficial for referee on field performances.

What is in store for season 2001 at this stage is not known, however, one thing is for sure, our squad of graded referees will be ready for whatever challenges are thrown at them.

Personally I would like to thank my wife, Karen and daughters, Joanne and Deborah for the support and patience shown to me all year. Mr Chris Turner and his Board have given me great support for the year and without their assistance I could not do what I do for the NSWRL.

I would like also to especially thank my team of assistant coaches namely, Messrs. Mick Ryan, Barry Goldsworthy, Ian McCall, John Melville, Les Mathews, Max Dunn and Peter Bungate. A great team to be associated and work with. I would also like to make mention of Max Dunn who every Monday is in the League offices calming and supporting me when I get frustrated with football club coaches and referee performances.

Appointing and coaching referees always requires accurate information of each referee's performance from their various games. In this aspect, we were fortunate in having an Advisory Board which included a number of new members, who took great care in analysing referees performances and produced reports that were both informative and accurate. To the Advisory Board members, a special thank you.

As always the Executive of the NSWRL Referees' Association has been extremely supportive to the NSWRL and myself. The working relationship between the NSWRL and the NSWRLRA is, fortunately, very strong and it will need to continue to be strong in season 2001 if referees are to receive the support they presently enjoy.

To Joanne Farr, my right hand at the NSWRL has again in season 2000 been a tower of strength. All referees should thank her for the way she supports the active referees and myself during the season.

NSWRL DELEGATES REPORT

Regrettably again for another year the NSWRL General Committee fulfilled a "claytons role" in the administration of the game. Outside of the Annual Meeting the one called in June, for information purposes, outlined the sorry state that the body, once crucial to the game, now finds itself.

It is both sad and ironic that the system which produced the players and coaches now earning totally unrealistic six figure sums annually is battling in an effort to find sponsorship to even retain the Narrabeen Academy facility. The hope held that the NRL would resurrect the game at least part of its former prestige and inject funds for and install confidence in the grass roots level has faded. Not that the NRL's financial position is open to scrutiny but as it was put to me recently if it was a public company you wouldn't be rushing off to buy shares. They urgently need to improve the overall image.

The League is currently addressing the high cost in running the First Division Competition particularly in relation to its administration. There is little doubt that our Association's active members will be impacted by these financial implications. Whilst no doubt we would fight hard to retain our existing benefits we are highly likely to suffer a loss in the number of appointments due to the suggested dropping of one of the lower grade competitions. The result in the State of Origin Series with public interest being maintained was not only satisfying but financially critical to the league.

Members should be congratulated on their on field performances and commitment. Refereeing the strong First Division competition and tough and certainly at times frustrating Metropolitan Cup does not receive the recognition it deserves. Special thanks to those non active members who support the League in appointing and coaching our active referees in these competitions.

The game I believe is being affected at certain levels whereby far too great an influence on refereeing is being applied by people with vested interests and that critical "separation of powers" is being eroded. Despite the difficulties being experienced by the changing face our game we must fight to retain the outstanding credibility which has been established by this association over what is now almost one hundred years.

SPONSORSHIP CO-ORDINATORS REPORT

Fellow members, it gives me great pleasure to present for your perusal a report on the activities and initiatives pursued by this Association in relation to sponsorship funding for Season 2000.

As you would be aware 1999 was the final year of our contract with FAI. Under the new funding arrangement we were required to negotiate a Funding Agreement with the NRL.

To assist us in this area, your Committee sought professional assistance from consultants Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu to prepare a Business and Strategic Plan for the development of Rugby League refereeing throughout Australia. This plan was presented to the Board of the NRL earlier this year and was put on "hold" pending their own plan to produce a Strategic Plan and carry out a re-assessment of all bodies associated with the game of Rugby League.

In the interim, the NRL agreed to provide funding for this year to the level provided last year.

In relation to expenditure and disbursement of this funding, total expenditure this year amounted to **\$334,100** against an approved budget of **\$351,700**.

This is a pleasing result when we consider the financial constraints placed upon the Association with the uncertainty of future funding arrangements.

Details of some of the initiatives were:-

- (a) Continued support for the N.S.W. Country R.L. Referees Association development programmes, with a total expenditure in this area of \$25,500, comprising
 - (i) Payment to facilitate the continued engagement of two Development Officers.
 - (ii) Funding for approved Development Programmes which include Annual Seminar, Northern and Southern N.S.W. Development Squads workshops and other Development Seminars throughout N.S.W.
- (b) \$10 000 to Queensland R.L. Referees Board to assist with Coaching and Development
- (c) The various District and "Developing States" Referees Associations received a total of \$29,000 to assist them with funding of Coaching and Development programmes and the administration of their Associations.
- (d) Funding for a "Train the Trainer" pilot project conducted jointly by Michael Stone from the NRL and Coaches from our Association at two NSW Regional country centres. Funding for this project was \$8,200.

A full outline of expenditure is as follows

Provision of four senior coaches for the benefit and improvement of those graded referees not participating in the NRL competition and three coaches for the Inter District Representative squad of referees.

Provision of monthly coaching seminars throughout the season in conjunction with the Association Meeting.	
Funding for a two day coaching seminar held at Wollongong for members of the Inter District Representative Squad, including invoices from selected country areas	

5. Provision of Masseurs \$ 30,100

Provision of Masseurs of a high professional standard to all NRL and N.S.W.R.L. matches controlled by our referees and to most Inter District Cup matches and organised Training Sessions

Where requested, masseurs are provided for the various district referees for their Final Series
Masseurs are provided with all equipment required to satisfactorily carry out their duties and uniforms displaying sponsors logo.

Note:- This is a net cost to the Association following receipt of contributions from the NRL

6. Assistance to Affiliated Associations \$ 53,200
(as previously outlined)

7. Country R.L. Referees Development Programme \$ 25,500
(as previously outlined)

8. National Referees Accreditation Scheme \$ 5,000
To assist with the continued development and effectiveness of this scheme N.S.W.R.L. Referees Association has appointed a co-ordinator to this scheme. This co-ordinator will control and work in close liaison with the various District Co-ordinators.

9. Australian Referees Association \$ 40,500
Continued support by way of funding for the everyday operations of this National Body, including the staging of the inaugural National Conference and the setting up of National Policy Committees comprising members selected from District and Group Associations

10. Administration Grant to NSWRLRA \$ 20,000
Funds provided to offset the general administrative costs of the Association. These costs include such expenses as insurance, Annual Report, external audit costs, legal advice, printing of constitution, Association newsletter, printing and stationery etc.

11. Association Travel \$ 5,700
Travel expenses for visits considered necessary by executive officers, referees coaches, leading active referees to country and interstate centres for purposes of the betterment of referees and administration of their associations' also travel and accommodation costs for leading Inter District Representative Referees to travel to interstate carnivals

12. Sponsorship Management \$ 18,100

Costs associated with the professional development and presentation of a Business and Strategic Plan for Refereeing
Representatives from various sponsors were entertained at a luncheon to mark the end of the season 2000

Sponsors were also entertained at various Association functions throughout the year

Sponsorship administration costs

Total Expenditure \$334,100

Once again, in conclusion I would like to thank the Executive of the Association for their support, fellow members of my Sponsorship Committee, Phil and Bryan for the work that they carried out in their designated area and in particular for filling the breach whilst I was on a extended holiday earlier this year.

I wish to advise members that I will not be standing for re-election as Sponsorship Co-ordinator at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting. Having had nine enjoyable years in this job, I now consider it time to move aside and offer the same opportunity to other members of the Association.

Members,

It's with great pleasure that I present for your adoption the Profit and Loss Statement and Balance Sheet for the year ended 30th September 2000.

This year saw some changes takes place in regards to the sponsorship agreements we previously had in place with both FAI and also Ansett. Season 2000 saw new agreements drawn up between the NRL and the sponsors direct.

In previous years this association was party to the actual contracts. In the long run things did not change greatly in that rather than receiving the funds directly from our sponsors our funds were forwarded via the NRL.

Prior to receiving these funds the NRL had requested that we supply to them a detailed business plan for the season. At this point we engaged the services of Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu who went through all aspects of our business.

They prepared a very detailed report which gave our committee the first opportunity to view actually what services we offer as an Association to various rugby league bodies not only in New South Wales but Australia wide.

Even though the funds received from the NRL were less than actually requested, this exercise proved to be a worthwhile investment for the future.

In terms of our accounts you will notice that we have gone from returning a surplus last year of \$18,811.50 to now returning a deficit this year of \$65,287.12. This loss ends up coming out of our cash reserves

Which you will notice has been reduced dramatically from last season. This is something I feel the incoming committee needs to address for the future considering the limited amount of funding available.

One thing that impacted on the Association towards the end of our year was the introduction of the GST. As we have a turnover greater than \$100,000 we are automatically caught in the GST web. Overall the impact is not that huge, however it does impact on people that supply services to this association.

TRAINING REPORT



Great effort on another successful training season. There were lots of ups and downs, highs and lows, frustrating moments and a lot of you displayed some bloody good 'G' & 'D' during those critical times.

Due to the 2000 Olympics, training required a great deal of strategic planning. I have been working on a four-year training program that commenced during the 1998-football season and was designed to progress through to the competitions season in 2001. This type of program was implemented in order to obtain optimal fitness levels, without burnout and subsequent injuries. Therefore training prescriptions were implemented in order to achieve this goal. The sessions were evaluated on a regular basis commencing from the **specific competition** phase in 1998. Likewise, as the current **transition period** is longer between this season and the next (2001) certain training requirements need to be implemented in order to maintain and once again increase fitness levels.

As mentioned on other occasions the specificity of training will suit the requirements of all referees and touch judges and that all training prescriptions will suit this criteria. The coming training season will also include at least four fitness assessments that will focus on the specific energy requirements for referees and touch judges. I am currently liaising will Denise regarding these fitness assessments.

October should see all of you, who are serious about being fit for next year's football season, doing at least two/three training sessions per week. Work out what it is you want to get out of refereeing, set yourself a personal management plan with short and long term goals and evaluate those personal goals on a regular basis. Please feel free to contact me at any time with any training enquiries.

On a lighter note and on behalf of Ron and Don, I would like to thank the NSW Rugby League Referees Association for their support throughout this football season and for the various BBQ's and other activities that we were invitations to, they were greatly appreciated.

Ron, Don and I would also like to take this opportunity in wishing you and your families all the very best for Christmas and the following New Year.
