CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Season 2011, has again demonstrated that our game is continuing to evolve with new initiatives and ideas to further improve the spectacle for the loyal fans. The Australian Rugby League Independent Commission is coming closer to being established with the considerable benefits it will bring to the game and its fans. It has been a long, hard and difficult process for the Independent Commission to take shape and your Board has worked hard thus far to make sure refereeing is not left behind both at NSWRLRA and ARLRA levels.

This year has seen some new important initiatives, undertaken by your Board such as:

The Widows Appreciation Luncheon. The Board thought that for too long we acknowledged all the referees of this Association in a number of ways through out and after their careers have ended, however we did not remember or recognise their partners once the Referee had passed away. With this initiative we have tried to address this anomaly.

The Board commenced dialogue with the Men of League to establish the Officials 300 Club. What we wanted to do is to acknowledge the Referees who have officiated in 300 first grade games. The Men of League already acknowledges the Players when they have reached 300 first grade games. We as a Board thought that it is important that Referees be acknowledged also. I am happy to announce that we have an in principle agreement with the Men of League for this initiative. The Launch of the Rugby League Officials 300 Club will occur at a major Men of League function in the early part of 2012. We are still compiling the records of referees who have officiated in 300 First Grade games. Names that come to mind are Bill Harrigan, Steven Clark, Steven Betts, Steven Chiddy, Col Pearce and there are others who will all be acknowledged at the launch.

Your Board has also established and launched the Women's Development Committee. The changing game of Rugby League has allowed more women to become mainstream officials. We have now in NSW over 75 Female Referees officiating. This presents a whole new range of problems where we as the head body would be remiss in not addressing. The Women's Development Committee is made up of women referees chaired by Joanne Spagarino, and has as members Faye Breslin, Sarah Harpley and Amie Gibson. The Committee has been given the task of advising our Association and the various Leagues by giving a voice, inclusion and equality to females and assisting in the development and support of female referees.

This year has also seen the Association resume control of the NSW Rugby League Graded Squad in partnership with the NSW Rugby League. This has allowed the Association to return to a leadership role in the development of referees in NSW. It has also returned this Association to the prominent position it should occupy.

Because of the changing nature of the NRL Squad with a number of its members coming from Queensland

and New Zealand, some from our Association and some being on full time or part time contracts, it caused, over a number of years a split/distancing of members of the NRL squad and the Association because the NRL Squad felt that their special needs could not at times be addressed. The Board decided that this needed to be addressed for the benefit of all referees and the Association. Discussion has been on going for some months between the Board of the NSWRLRA and the NRL squad in bringing all referees of the two squads together. The aim is for all referees that officiate in the NRL and NSW Rugby League Competitions to be members of our Association. I am particularly pleased that considerable progress has been achieved towards reaching a structure which benefits all.

Further into this Annual Report you will read of the considerable on field success achieved by our Association's active members, such as and not limited to Messer's Tony Archer controlling his 5th Grand Final; Matt Cecchin making his debut as a First Grade Grand Final referee in conjunction with Daniel Eastwood who, apart from making his debut as First Grade Grand Final Touch Judge also officiated in his first State of Origin; Jared Maxwell and Ben Cummins making their debut in State of Origin; Adam Devcich controlling a Test Match in Papua New Guinea; Matt Cecchin and Paul Holland appointed to the Gillette Four Nations tournament in England; David Munro officiating his first Toyota Cup Grand Final; Jonathan Stone for his first NSW Cup Grand Final and Robert Bowen for his first Bundaberg Cup Grand Final.

Congratulations to all for being rewarded for their hard work. All the active members I have mentioned and the ones I did not mention but are listed further on into this report achieved such success due to their dedication and will to succeed assisted enormously by their coaching staff of Messrs William Harrigan, Stuart Raper, Russell Smith and Patrick Reynolds. I must acknowledge both Bill Harrigan and Stuart Raper in their first season as the Head Coaches of the NRL Squad. From the very first day they took the job on they sought the assistance and partnership of the Association in making sure the referees were given the best opportunities to proceed to the NRL. It has been a very successful season in this regard due to the cooperation and working relationship we have established with both Bill and Stuart.

The NSW Rugby League competitions have again continued to improve in standard and quality of play. Again our members have distinguished themselves and made this Association proud by the way they have controlled the games. The success of the NSWRLRA Graded Squad cannot be achieved without the assistance and mentoring

of all the coaches namely Tony Danks, Steven Clark, Peter Filmer and Phil Cooley and all the Match Day Assessors who give time and guidance to make sure referees are best prepared for every game.

The Junior Development Squad represents a major success for our Association. Seven members of that squad were graded into the NSWRL Graded Squad proving once again the quality of young referees being produced from grass roots to the J/D Squad then onto the Graded Squad. I would like to wholeheartedly congratulate Messer's Mick Lewis, Tony Danks, Peter Bungate, Paul Kalina, Bryan Gilchrist, Steve Clapson and Steven Clark for the outstanding success the squad has had this year. A large number of this Junior Development Squad will, I am certain, be graded and move into the elite level of the game in a very short time.

At season end Mr. Steve Chiddy announced his retirement from the NRL Squad. Stephen can be very proud of his achievement whilst an active referee. For an Official to rack up more than 300 First Grade games he must have had considerable ability and dedication and Stephen had loads of both.

Unfortunately this year has seen the passing of two valued Life Members of our Association namely Mr. Bob Styles and Mr John Montgomery. To Bob's and John's families I personally and on behalf of the Association would like to pass on our deepest sympathies.

For our Association, this year, again, has seen challenges which have been met and dealt with in a most successful manner. We are very fortunate to have a Board made up of very dedicated, hard working people none more than your Executive Officer Mr. Frank Leonard who continues to dedicate considerable time in making sure this Association continues to prosper. To all my Board members I would like to place on record my sincere thanks for your contribution and hard work throughout season 2011. In particular Mr. Greg McCallum, who in his portfolio has had to deal with a number of issues where it has been particularly difficult for the Association and its members.

Also Mr. Doug Keen has really engaged all our affiliates with the workings of our Board and made sure the communication lines between all were enhanced. Also Luke Bugden's contribution cannot go by without being recognised. Luke continues to put the Active Member's interests to the fore front. This year has seen a new Finance Director join our Board. Jimmy Oliveira has really taken to the job with gusto and has learned quickly the workings of being a Finance Director. Congratulations Jimmy on your first year on the Board, the members can be proud of your efforts. Last but not least, Mr. George Jankowski, who continues to do the hard yards without too much fanfare. He has been the link between our Board and the NRL Squad which has helped enormously in addressing their special needs.

Also I would like to pass on a special thank you to Mr. Tony Danks, NSW Rugby League Referees Development

Manager. He was a very strong supporter of this Association. We as an Association were very fortunate to have Tony in the role he has with the NSW Rugby League. To Mr. John Chalk and Mr. Geoff Carr and his loyal staff at the NSW Rugby League also a special thank you for your assistance and support throughout the year. This year saw the election on Mr. John Chalk as the new Chairperson of the NSWRL and ARL and our Association is very fortunate to have a Chairperson of the calibre of John Chalk and a General Manager of the calibre of Geoff Carr who really appreciate the worth that our members are to the game of Rugby League and who have been very supportive in all our initiatives this year.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

I submit for your consideration, approval and adoption, the 104th Annual Report and Financial Statement from the Board of Directors of the NSW Rugby League Referees Association for season 2011.

2011 has been another year of initiatives and forward momentum by the current Board of the Association. Included amongst the initiatives were the establishment of a Peer Support and Welfare Committee and a Womens' Development Committee, the initial Widows' Appreciation Luncheon, the return of the Graded Squad to the control of the NSWRLRA, a restructured Coaching Panel covering both the Graded and the Junior Representative squads and the establishment of negotiations with representatives of the NRL Squad designed to find a modified Board/Association structure that will lead to improvement in the manner in which the needs of the NRL Squad are addressed by the Association.

Having successfully secured the position of Head Coach of the Junior Representative squad for a period of two years, Michael Lewis led the panel consisting of Peter Bungate, Bryan Gilchrist, Steve Clapson and Paul Kalina and, under Michael's leadership the Panel's contribution to the development of the 54 referees in the squad was outstanding.. Again, as in 2010, following the completion of the Harold Matthews and S.G.Ball competitions the Panel visited District Junior League competitions with the view to identify new talent for the Junior Development Squad. Arising from this exercise, fifteen referees were identified to trial with the junior representative squad during October and November.

With the return of the Graded Squad to the Association's management and control, Tony Danks assumed responsibility for the Squad as the Referees' Coaching and Development Manager employed by the NSWRL. The Association appointed Peter Filmer and Phil Cooley as coaches and Steve Clark was appointed as the Technical and Performance Coach to both Squads. The feedback from the Graded Squad on the contribution of this Panel during 2011 has been very positive.

The NSW Rugby League All Schools Carnival held in the Penrith District saw four referees from New Zealand and seven from the Emerging States (Victoria, Western Australia, Tasmania and Northern Territory) included in the recruitment of some ninety referees undertaken by the Committee consisting of Tony Danks, Doug Keen, Jack O'Sullivan, Cathy Crowe and myself. This initiative, introduced in 2010 with the support of Graham McNaney from the ARL Development, saw these referees compliment those recruited from the Junior Development Squad and Country Rugby League Referees' Association who were appointed to games over the three days. Many thanks to all the volunteer Officials for their management, appointment and coaching of the referees against whom not one complaint was lodged.

The Seniors/Life Members luncheon held on Saturday 1st October, the day before the Grand Final, saw sixty three in attendance with lan Heads OAM presenting the



Laurie Bruyeres Recitation. Another highlight was the appearance and contribution through his comedy routine of John Peard. Congratulations to Greg McCallum for the organisation and conduct of the day including his suggesting, designing and procuring glass place mats designed specifically for the occasion and his performance as the Master of Ceremonies.

REFEREE MOVEMENTS

To begin season 2011 no retirements from the NRL or Graded Squads were announced. Following the completion of the H.Matthews and S.G Ball Competitions, Liam Nicholls, Ryan Jackson, Kasey Badger and Scot Murray were Graded. At the conclusion of the season Peter Crombie Brown, Gavin King and Mitchell Stone were graded as specialist Touch Judges. Under the newly appointed NRL Coach, Bill Harrigan, several Graded Squad referees made their debut in the NRL competition. They were David Munro, Brendon Wood, Adam Gee, Grant Atkins, David Ryan, Nick Beashel and Peter Gough (Old).

At the Col Pearce Medal Presentation luncheon conducted by the NRL Squad on Sunday 25th September, Steve Chiddy announced that he was retiring after twenty five years in the game much of which was spent in First Grade and included major representative honours including Grand Finals, State of Origin and Test Matches.

To the NRL and their administration of the Telstra Premiership competition that was closely contested, often very exciting and , as we have come to expect, not without some dramas. All of this makes for extensive media coverage where, on television, the product and the viewing audience numbers have never been better. Our referees are an integral part of and fundamental to this. To the ARL and the NSWRL on their efforts in conducting the various competitions for which they are responsible. All eyes are now on the emergence of the Commission and the change and initiatives that it will bring to the game.

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DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT

JIMMY OLIVEIRA

It is with pleasure that I present for your adoption the audited Profit and Loss Statement & Balance Sheet for the year ended September 30, 2011.

I took over the Director of Finance role from Darren Alchin in 2011 and I would like to thank Darren for making the transition a smooth and relatively easy for me with his support as I required it throughout 2011 with BAS (GST) submissions, correct expense categories and policy & procedures.

The Association received funding for all our operations and programs through a grant provided to us through the NSWRL. The grant for 2011 totalled \$399,840 which was a 21% increase on our 2010 figure. This increase was due to the revised budget submission for NSWRLRA resuming control of the NSW Cup Graded Squad in partnership with the NSWRL and hence the responsibility for paying all associated expenses including some which were previously paid by the NRL.

Through operating a fiscal policy focused to concentrating maximum spending on the development of referees in NSW, I was able to apply a further increase to the payments of our 2011 coaching panel for their grade squad skills coaching session attendances.

Early in 2011 I managed to navigate us through some tight cash flow situations and it has been a relatively smooth year financially for the association since, thanks to Greg Pollard the Chief Financial Controller of the NSWRL for his timely payment of our grant instalment invoices and acceptance of my revised budget increase for season 2011.

The association finished with an operating profit of \$7959 for the year ended September 30, 2011 which is fair result due to some underspending in our gear budget resulting from cancelling some gear orders placed with our old gear supplier once the NRL announced they were contracting Fi-Ta as their new supplier of referees uniforms in 2012 with whom the surplus will be spent.

There was an increase in social spending this year as the board decided to combine the NSWRLRA Ladies & Life Members night with the Mick Stone Medal presentation night.

Previously the Association received our grant paid in 3 instalments throughout the year, however, the increased budget for 2011 has resulted in our grant now being paid in 4 instalments per annum.

Our budget for 2012 has been submitted to the NSWRL with some increases in funding sought in the area of referees coaching and development, however, the introduction of the Independent Commission may have an effect on our future funding.

Referee exchange programs for the Junior Development Squad and the NSW & Bundy Cup Squad plus several School Boy Developments Carnivals in Perth, Western Australia, Melbourne, Victoria and in Saint Marys, Sydney were all funded by the Association.

Administration Grants of \$1500 were provided to every Affiliated Association who had 4 attendees at the Affiliated Districts Conference for the entire weekend and had entered all their members correctly in the ARLD leaguenet database while Coaching and Development Grants paid to our Affiliated Associations for their C&D programs continued, with 8 Affiliates receiving \$3500 while the rest received \$2500 and dual affiliates were granted \$1500 each. The Workplace Relations Committee in early 2011 submitted a log of claims to the NSW Rugby League on behalf of all our active referees in the NSW Cup & Junior Development Squad and after much negotiation a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the NSWRLRA & the NSWRL was entered into for 2011 and beyond which clearly outlines the policies and procedures formerly in place between the NSWRLRA and the NSWRL and resulted in an increase in our match fee payment for the first time since 2007-8.

Thank you Matt Hawkins for all your work and effort in completing the MOU document on behalf of the association and all our active members. I look forward to expanding the MOU to cover our coaches, evaluators and match days assessors from 2012 onwards.

Thanks to our Trainers and Masseurs on behalf of John McCormack our Director of Rubbers and myself, all the active referees and the Association we are all appreciative of your professionalism and great assistance on games days and at training sessions throughout the season.



After consultation with the Association, Peter Filmer, & Phil Cooley were appointed as Coaches with Steve Clark in a position as Coach and he was our liaison between the NRL Referees & Coaches. As well, he was also appointed to a Coaching Role with the Junior Representative Squad.

A meeting was arranged in Phillip Street with the NSWRL, the Coaches and Management, Board members of NSWRLRA and the Grade squad so they could meet with the squad to introduce themselves and to outline our planning strategies for 2011. Bill Harrigan & Stuart Raper also attended with Bill outlining his intentions for the new season with a back to basics refereeing style to be at the fore front, plus he informed the meeting that we would now have Touch Judges not Side Line Officials and that they would go back to their original positions in line with the ruck. Bill also explained that he could not give his total support to our structure until he knew that we were following the same principles. role as Video Referee. Don Stuart was promoted to the Referee's Operation Manager and did a terrific job. Klint Hoare and his offsider Tom Wilson again did the job well of having the boys in top condition. To all of you, a big thank you, job well done.

We knew we had to do some things a little differently in 2011. 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
requirements are more standardised regardless of what district you come from.

Best wishes to all members for the festive season and see you all again in 2012.








